Available online since 1987, BCIN is a trusted resource for professionals, museums and other heritage organizations. It facilitates retrieval and exchange of information on cultural heritage preservation.

For now, the database contains more than 260,000 citations.

The first 34 volumes of the Art and Archaeological Technical abstracts are also contained in this database (prior to 1998).
